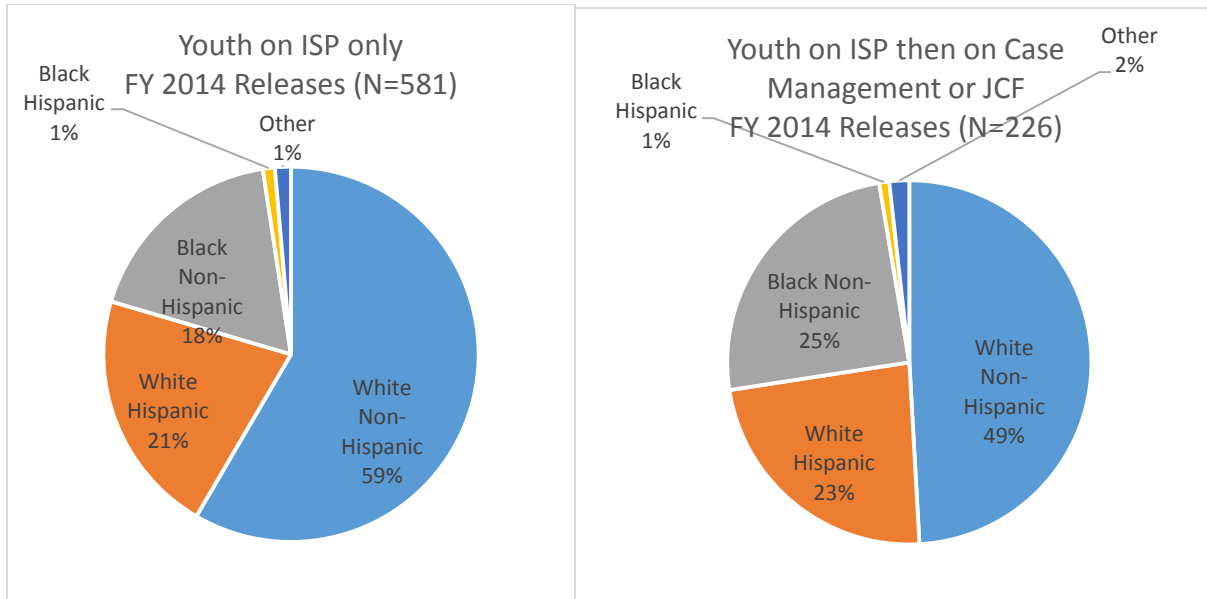


KDOC Data Analysis Follow Up

On August 18th, workgroup members asked the following questions of the Pew team:

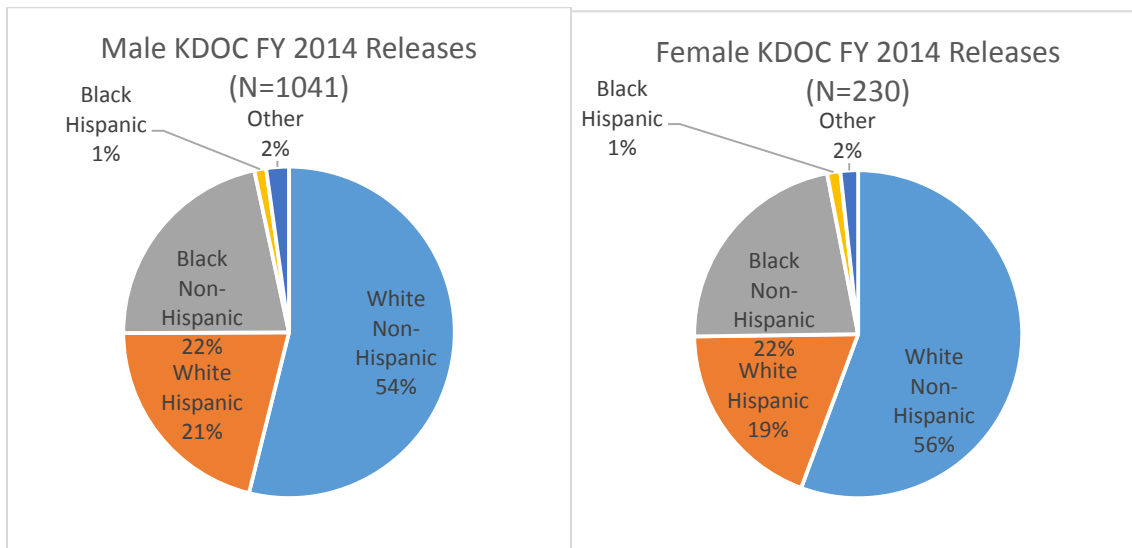
Q: Is the race breakdown different for youth who start on ISP then go out of home, vs. youth who just stay on ISP?

A: There is a higher proportion of non-white non-Hispanic youth among youth who are first on ISP then go on Case Management or JCF, compared to youth who are only on ISP.



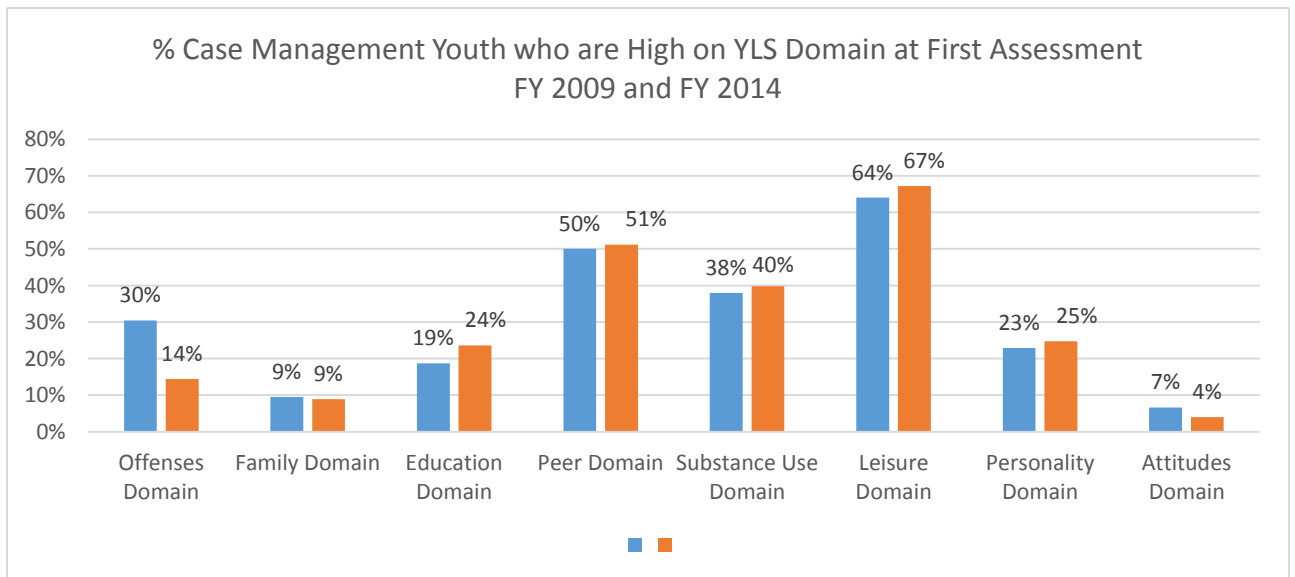
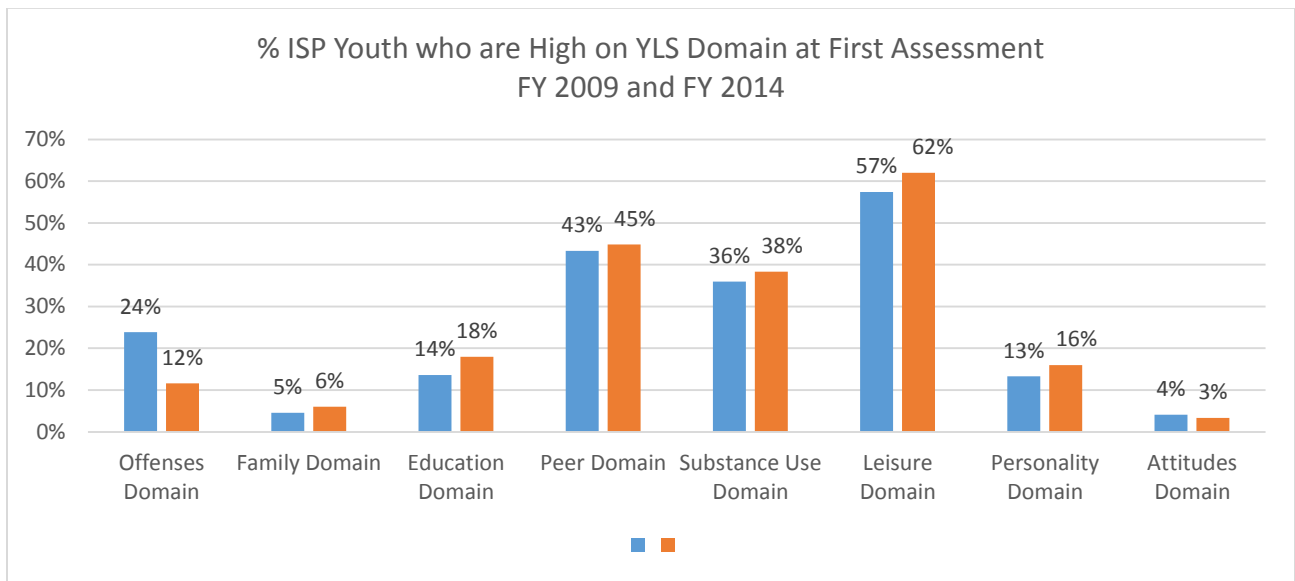
Q: Is the race breakdown different by gender?

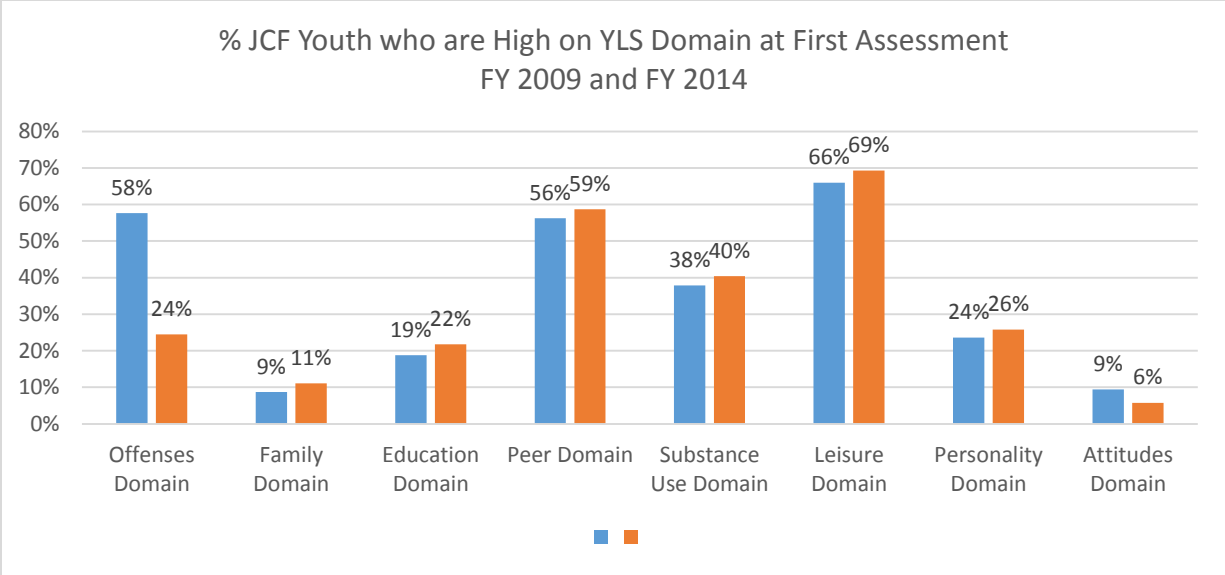
A: The race breakdown is very similar for male and female KDOC youth.



Q: Have the criminogenic needs of KDOC youth changed over time?

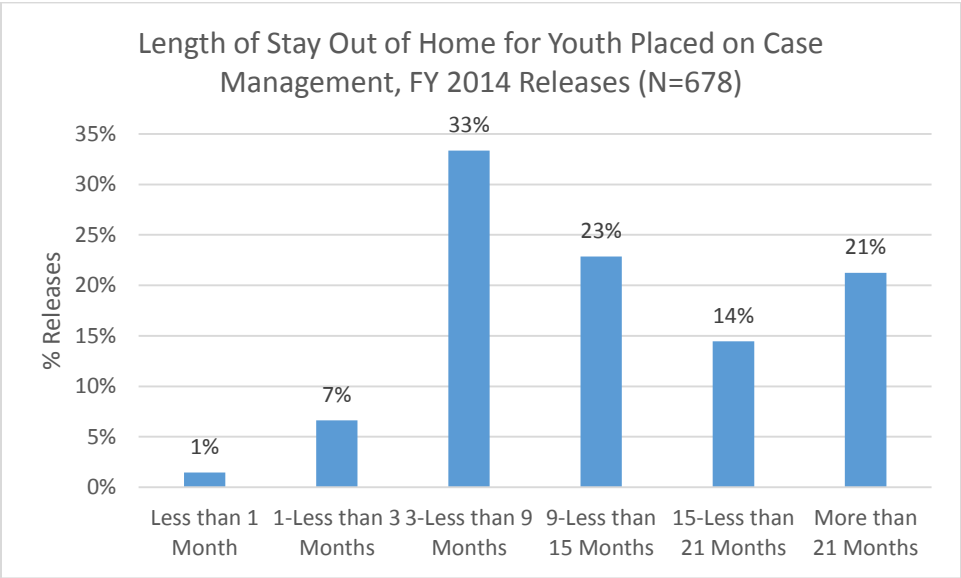
A: Below is the YLS domain breakdown for youth released in FY 2009 (the earliest year where the data are valid) compared to youth released in FY 2014. All domains are similar across years for ISP, Case Management and JCF youth, with the exception of the offenses domain, which was higher in FY 2009 for all disposition types.

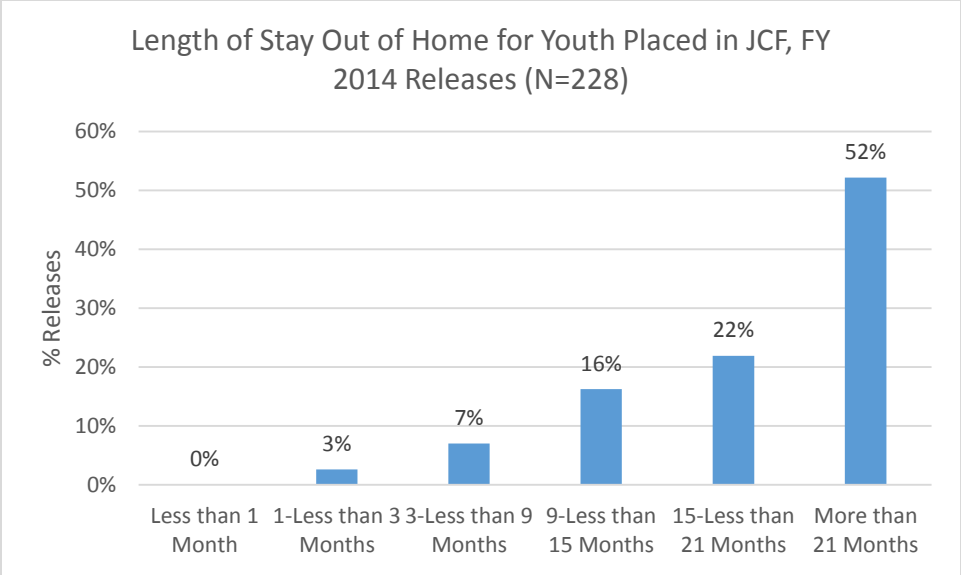




Q: What is the length of stay breakdown for youth on Case Management and JCF (more specific breakdown than the average)?

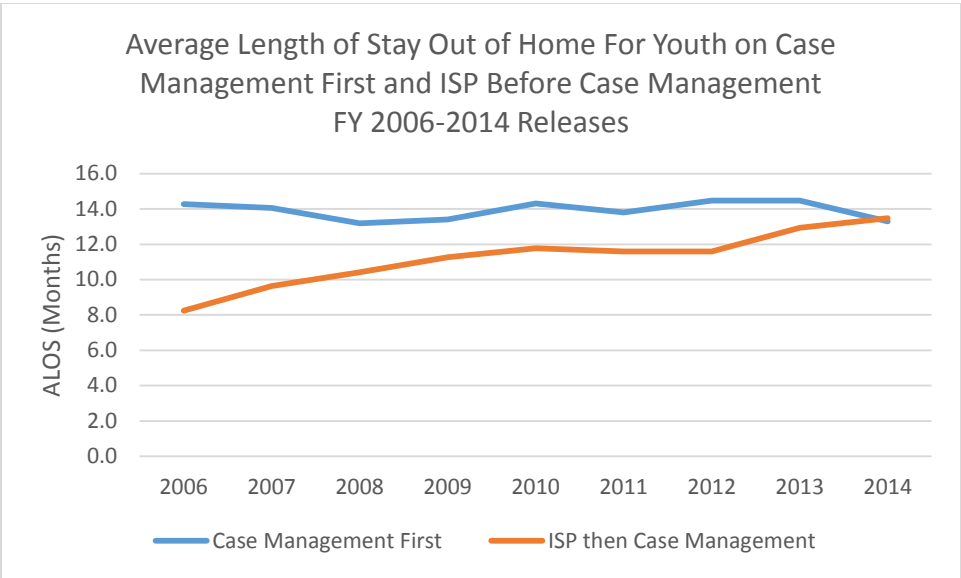
A: Below is the length of stay breakdown – 21% of Case Management youth and 52% of JCF youth stay more than 21 months out of home.





Q: Are average length of stay out of home trends different for youth who start on ISP vs. youth who start on Case Management?

A: Yes, the average length of stay out of home has increased 63% for youth who start on ISP then go on Case Management, while youth who start on Case Management have seen a 7% decrease in their average length of stay out of home.

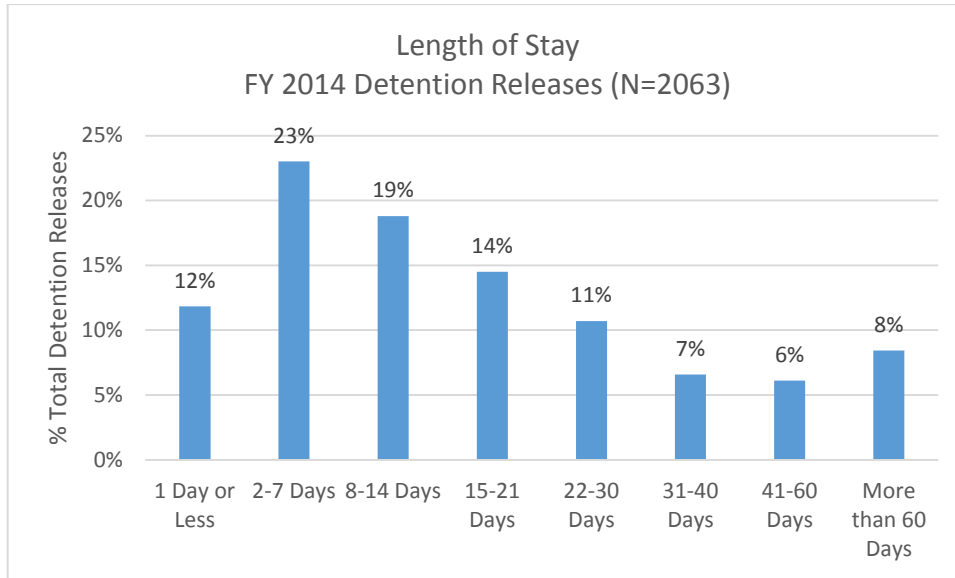


Q: What are the restitution costs for KDOC youth?

A: Across the FY 2014 KDOC cases (N=166 with restitution payment noted¹) the average restitution payment was \$1,776. The minimum was \$5, the maximum was \$63,227.

Q: What is the average length of stay in detention?

A: Among FY 2014 detention releases, the average length of a detention stay was 23.5 days. Below is the length of stay breakdown for these stays:



¹ These data may not represent all KDOC cases where youth are required to pay restitution, only the cases where a restitution amount is noted in the KDOC data.
